

James Cobb to Speak at Athens Regional Library: A Special Invitation to UGARA Members and Friends

James C. Cobb, Spalding Distinguished Professor in the History of the American South, a native Georgian and an entertaining writer and speaker in great demand, will discuss his most recent book, *Away Down South: A History of Southern Identity* on **Wednesday, February 8, at Athens Regional Library, from 10:00 until noon.** This event will be sponsored by the University of Georgia Retirees Association. All UGARA members and friends are invited to attend.

Dr. Cobb is a Hart County native who received his A.B., M.A., and Ph.D degrees from the University of Georgia, and then taught at a variety of higher education institutions, including the University of Maryland, the University of Mississippi, the University of Alabama, and the University of Tennessee before returning to The University of Georgia in 1997. former president of the Southern Historical Association, Cobb has published 19 books and more than three dozen articles. He also has written columns for the *New York Times*, the *Wall Street Journal*, the *Los Angeles Times*, and the *London Times Literary Supplement*, and he has lectured across the United States and in England.
