An Invitation to Recall Your Days at UGA: The University of Georgia Legacy Project

In March 2006 Fran Lane of the UGA Visitors Center and Claude McBride of the UGA Alumni Association began a joint effort to collect, preserve and make available filmed interviews with notable UGA alumni. Recently, Claude and Fran presented a preview of one of these videos, which is a 20 minute compilation of some outstanding memories of Mr. Tyus Butler, Dr. George Marshall, Mr. Dan MaGill, Dr. Louise McBee, Dr. Henry King Stanford, Mrs. Joanna Stegeman Traylor, and Mr. Charlie Trippi. UGARA members and other alumni were invited to come to Athens Regional Library for the viewing and those who did reacted very positively, voiced their own recollections, and asked numerous questions.

The intention of the UGA Legacy Project is to preserve this oral history for research purposes, but also to remind us as alumni of how we and UGA actually were in our years here, and to continue to tie us all together through our recollections. To date, two of the videos, filmed and edited by UGA videographer Bill Evelyn, are complete. By calling the UGA Visitors' Center information desk at 706-542-0UGA, you and your family and friends can arrange a time to come by the Visitors' Center to view them. Our advice to UGARA members is that you not wait until football season to reserve a time for what is destined to be a popular family event.

The UGA Legacy Project tapes also will be permanently archived, available in the UGA Library, and transcribed in print. This is a time-intensive and meticulous effort. So far nine interviews have been taped. Public Affairs would like to complete twelve more this calendar year and hopes to continue this project in following years.


Trip to the Flat Rock Playhouse - July 18
